Text: Genesis 2:18 ESV

Target: We are wired for connection not isolation.

Barriers to Biblical Friendship:

Our **longing** for independence

Our loop of the past.

Biblical friendship requires:

1. Cost

a. "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends." -**John 15:13 ESV**

Question #1: John 15:13 speaks of laying down one's life for a friend. What are some practical ways we can sacrificially love our friends today?

Question #2: Have you ever had a friend who made a sacrifice for you? How did that impact your relationship

2. Consistency

- a. A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for adversity. -Proverbs 17:17 ESV
- **b.** "A man of many companions may come to ruin, but there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother." -Proverbs 18:24 ESV

Question #3: Proverbs 17:17 says a friend loves at all times. Do you have friendships that have stood the test of time and adversity? What made them last?

Question #4: What does it mean to be a "friend who sticks closer than a brother" (Proverbs 18:24)? How can we become that kind of friend?

3. Confrontation

a. An open rebuke is better than hidden love! Wounds from a sincere friend are better than many kisses from an enemy. -**Proverbs 27:5-6 NLT b**.

Whoever rebukes a person will in the end gain favor rather than one who has a flattering tongue. -Proverbs 28:23 NIV

Question #5: Proverbs 27:5-6 says that wounds from a friend are better than kisses from an enemy. Have you ever received a difficult truth from a friend that helped you grow? How did you respond?

Question #6: What keeps us from lovingly confronting our friends when we see them heading in the wrong direction?

4. Confidants

- a. Whoever goes about slandering reveals secrets, but he who is trustworthy in spirit keeps a thing covered. -Proverbs 11:13 ESV
- b. Whoever covers an offense seeks love, but he who repeats a matter separates close friends. -Proverbs 17:9 ESV

Question #7: What qualities do you look for in a trustworthy friend?

Question #8: Have you ever shared something in confidence and had it broken? How did that affect your view of friendship?

Question #9: How can we create a culture of trust and accountability in our friendships?

5. Covenant

a. And Jonathan made a covenant with David because he loved him as himself. -1 Samuel 18:3 NIV

Question #10: In 1 Samuel 18:3, Jonathan made a covenant with David. What does it mean to have a covenant friendship today?

Question #11: Are there friendships in your life that need to move from casual to committed? How can you be intentional about deepening those relationships?

Take Away: Determine which seat your friends sit in and reassign if you need to.

Question #12: Think about your close friendships. Are they helping or hindering your walk with Christ? Do you need to reassess who is in your inner circle?

Question #13: How can you be a better friend to those around you this week?
