Title: Light It Up Text: John 8:1-12

Target: Darkness has no hold on you.

- I. The Setting: Feast of Tabernacles
 - A. Place of Commemoration: "Mount of Olives" (Vs. 1)
 - **B. Picture of Correlation:** "Early in the morning he came again to the **temple**. All the people came to him, and he sat down and taught them." (Vs. 2)
- II. The Spectacle: Caught in the Act
 - A. Circle of Condemnation: "The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery, and placing her in the midst they said to him, "Teacher, this woman has been caught in the act of adultery." (Vs. 3-4)
 - **B.** Challenge of Justice: "Now in the Law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?" (Vs. 5)
- III. The Showdown: Pharisees/Scribes Vs. Jesus
 - **A. Falsely Charged:** "This they said to test him, that they might have some charge to bring against him." (Vs. 6a)
 - **B. Finger of God:** "Jesus bent down and wrote with his finger on the ground." (Vs. 6b)
 - **C. First Stone**: "And as they continued to ask him, he stood up and said to them, "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her." (Vs. 7)
 - **D.** Fine Print: "And once more he bent down and wrote on the ground." (Vs. 8)
- IV. The Statements: Life Changing Conversation
 - A. Condemned No More: "Jesus stood up and said to her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She said, "No one, Lord." And Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you; go, and from now on sin no more." (Vs. 10-11)
 - **B.** Light of the World: "Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (Vs. 12)
 - 1. Light Exposes Darkness
 - 2. Light Warns of Danger
 - 3. Light Gives Distinction
 - **4.** Light Provides Direction

Takeaway: Darkness can never overcome the Light.
