Sermon Discussion Questions: 9/28-29 & 10/2

Title: It's not just entertainment.

Text: 1 Timothy 4:2

Target: Stand firm against a satanic agenda!

Key Thought: 7 spheres of influence in society: Family, Church, Education, Media, Arts/Entertainment, Business & Govt.

- I. The Satanic Agenda in Music: Music is a Medium
 - A. Satan was Musical: Ezekiel 28:12-19
 - 1. Full of Wisdom and Beauty (Vs. 12)
 - 2. Musical: (Vs. 13)
 - 3. Anointed cherub (Vs. 14)
 - 4. Position of Leadership (Vs. 14)
 - 5. Lead $\frac{1}{3}$ of the angels to rebel (Rev. 12:14/Is. 14:12-14)
 - **B.** Music influences Culture: "Again, the devil took Him(Jesus) to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory. (Matthew 4:8)
 - 1. Music has a dual nature: (Good or Evil)
 - 2. **Music evokes a response:** (joy, hope, sadness, anger, etc.)
 - 3. **Music shapes value systems:** (lyrics become beliefs delivered by popular influential persuasion)
 - **4. Music impacts behavioral ethics:** (human flourishing, desensitization or societal deconstruction)
 - C. Examples of Satanic imagery and Lyrics: (Shock Value or Serious)
 - 1. Expression of Anarchy/Humanism? This is the agenda of Satan. Make yourself god!
 - **2.** Fame and Fortune? No other gods!
 - 3. Bowed Down in Exchange for Glory? Not just a temptation for Jesus, but for you...

Question #1: Music often evokes strong emotions. What emotions do you find yourself experiencing most often with certain songs? How do these emotions influence your thoughts and actions?

Question #2: In what ways do you think music contributes to behaviors that might be harmful or destructive in society? Have you seen this reflected in your own experiences or in your community?

- II. The Satanic Agenda in Movies & Media (Gaming):
 - **A. REwrite God's Plan:** (3 Circles) Glorification of Brokenness.
 - 1. Subtle Themes:
 - a) Distort Moral Values: Normalize Sinful Behavior
 - **b)** Promote Darkness: Depict Violence, Nudity, Sexuality, Immorality.
 - **c)** Change Beliefs: Biblical or Secular Worldview?
 - (1) Deconstruction of Traditional Marriage & Family.
 - (2) Homosexuality and Transgenderism glamorized.
 - (3) Erase Absolute Truth, which is God's Word..

- (4) Humanism and Pluralism becomes the Focus
- 2. Specific Themes:
 - a) Blur the Line: Good witches are portrayed using sorcery, use of spells to defend against evil only causing more interest in the occult by those influenced.
 - b) Direct Affront to Jesus: Satan more powerful than Jesus (NOT TRUE!)
- **B. REvisit the Garden:** Satan says to Eve: "Did God surely say? (Genesis 3:1)
 - 1. Doubt God: God has lied to you and is holding out on you.
 - 2. Deny God: You don't need God, you be God.
 - 3. **Defy God:** There are no consequences to your choices.

Question #3 What boundaries have you set in your life regarding media consumption? How effective have they been, and what challenges have you faced in maintaining them?

Question #4 Genesis 3:1 mentions Satan's strategy of causing doubt. Have you experienced moments of doubt in your faith? How did you address those moments, and what helped you regain confidence?

- III. The Christians Defense against Satan's Agenda: Ephesians 6:12
 - A. Biblical Direction: Proverbs 4:23 (Don't Let an ANTI-CHRIST influence have an inch your life)
 - 1. **Don't Conform to the World:** (Romans 12:2)
 - 2. You Must Exercise Discernment: (Phil. 4:8)
 - 3. Test Every Spirit and Abstain from Evil: 1 Thess. 5:21-22
 - 4. Guard our Hearts and Minds: (2 Cor. 10:5)
 - **5. Give No Footholds:** (Ephesians 4:27)
 - **6. Don't Grieve the Holy Spirit:** (Ephesians 4:30)
 - 7. **Pray for Protection:** Prayer is a shield to the soul, a sacrifice to God and a scourge to Satan. (John Bunyan)
 - **B.** Practical Suggestion: Don't be Mindless, be Mindful.
 - 1. Take Inventory: Be informed of lyrics, imagery, and agendas being pushed.
 - 2. Set Boundaries: Know your limits of what influences you from Christ and not Christ.
 - **3.** Create Accountability: Allow people to know what you consume, especially children and parents.

Question #5 What practical steps do you take to discern whether the media you consume aligns with your faith? How do you apply Philippians 4:8 in your daily life?

Question #6 Romans 12:2 warns against conforming to the world. In what areas do you struggle with this? How can your community group support you in standing firm?
